To participate in this campaign – to become a donor – is to help Christian servant leaders discover God's calling for their lives and prepare them to go where most of us cannot go.



#### INVESTING IN

### Student Scholarships

Here is our challenge: many families don't have the financial means to cover the cost of attending WLC. Students need significant scholarships to attend here as we are not a college of financial elites. Our students come from hard-working, middle-class families. In fact, nearly two-thirds of our students come from families with a combined household income of less than \$110,000. Knowing this, we work very hard to make WLC as affordable as possible!

WLC is an independent Christian college; a church body doesn't own us, nor do we receive any financial support from a synod. We exist because God's people – individuals like you – believe in and have trust and confidence in our mission. Your scholarship gifts will help transform our society by helping WLC prepare Christian leaders with a heart to serve. Far too many young people want to attend WLC, but they can't afford it due to their socio-economic realities. You can be a difference-maker by giving a gift to scholarships.











#### **ENHANCING THE**

### **Outdoor Athletic Complex**

Did you know that more than 45% of WLC students participate in our NCAA Division III athletics programs? Our Outdoor Athletic Complex opened in 2004 and has served the college and community with excellent facilities. However, as the number of athletes has grown, we need to maximize and utilize existing spaces. Replacing the grass soccer field with a turf field will alleviate canceled games due to rain, allow for additional sports to practice, and expand our ability to rent the field to provide another source of revenue. Purchasing a seasonal dome to cover the new soccer turf field will give the studentathletes another indoor location to practice and train six months of the year. Adding turf to the infield of our baseball field and to our softball field will help alleviate weather cancellations. All WLC students would benefit from these enhancements due to the expansion of intramural sports offerings. In addition to these improvements, new revenue streams would be realized by expanding the use of our facilities through outside rentals. The unique location of our Outdoor Athletic Complex attracts many community events, bringing thousands of visitors and prospective students to experience athletics at WLC.









### **GROWING THE**

### Endowment

Securing the future funding needs for WLC is on the minds of many supporters. Endowed scholarships, faculty chairs, professorships, and programs provide a legacy for donors as well as a permanent source of future funds for student scholarships and faculty growth.

WLC seeks to be debt-free by 2032, allowing for more resources to be directed to student and faculty needs. The Endowed Legacy Fund is a restricted fund and a unique opportunity for donors to help pay off the capital debt of the college in full before the debt is due in 2032. This fund is managed separately from the traditional endowment fund.

The current traditional endowment balance is more than \$28,000,000, and the Endowed Legacy Fund balance is more than \$16,000,000. A growing endowment fund will significantly impact our young institution and provide for a secure financial future.

## Facilities & Technology

Niche.com has consistently ranked WLC campus facilities and student residences in the top five in the state of Wisconsin. Having a campus that is well kept and up to date helps attract students. Under the leadership of our first full-time president Dr. Gary J. Greenfield, a majority of our campus buildings were built. Twenty-plus years later, we need to continue investing in remodeling and updating facilities and technology. Dr. Greenfield's legacy was creating a space that Christian students would enjoy and appreciate. In honor of former President Greenfield, a campus improvement fund has been established to help keep WLC looking great for the next generation of students. Improvements will include updating student residences and teaching spaces, replacing infrastructure, and enhancing the technology available to students, faculty, and staff.

#### INTRODUCING NEW

### Program Initiatives

The Board of Regents approved the college's new strategic plan in October 2021, including several initiatives to help grow enrollment. Programs under consideration range from Esports to new undergraduate and graduate majors. Any new program requires start-up capital and human resources before it draws an adequate number of students to pay for itself. Over the last decade, WLC has invested in new strategic majors and programs that paved the way for record freshman classes during that same time frame. In addition to new programs, we will seek ways to grow current programs through new initiatives and pathways. Your investment in this area could help attract students who never considered attending WLC.

### Chapel Enhancements

Worship is an essential component of WLC's mission and is integrated throughout the student experience. Our Chapel is used nearly every day of the week, and its last significant improvement was in 1998. **Updating** the original Chapel, built in 1927, demonstrates our commitment to student worship opportunities. We seek to provide a comfortable and aesthetically pleasing space for one of our most important activities. Aspects of the project include painting, replacing chapel chairs and carpeting, and installing new acoustic treatment and HVAC systems.
